He reviewed the Town of Scipio Rules for Decorum at Public Meetings.

- 4. Issues from town residents Joanne Nombris spoke against the Agricola Wind Project and would like to see it stopped. She resents not having local input in the process before the application was submitted. She showed numerous pages of signatures from residents against the installation of wind turbines in Scipio and Venice. Anita Dungey spoke on the infringement of Home Rule, the sacrifice and loss of local character and lack of local review and input due to the ORES process.

- 6. Liberty-Renewable Agricola Project Update Representatives spoke on the permitting process, and the response to the Notice of Incomplete Application to the New York State Office of Renewable Energy Siting for a Siting Permit for Major Renewable Energy Facility. Members of the Town Board asked questions on several subjects including the number of truckloads of material needed to build each tower base, the Decommissioning Plan, the Road Use Agreement, obsolete technology, Flicker effect, redactions in the permit application and what effect does this have on Owasco Lake.

 - c. Clerk January 2025 disbursements to the town Supervisor were \$1,503.00. As of February 11, 2025, 904 tax payments have been processed with 72 hours of office time clocked by Tax Collector, since January 4, 2025.
 - d. Highway Superintendent reported his crew has been busy with snow removal on town roads. The new pick-up truck was delivered, and the older pick-up truck will go to auction. The paperwork for the new Salt Shed is under DEC review. The heat pump was installed in the Highway Garage and the septic system will need an upgrade due to a frozen drainage pipe between the garage and the septic tank.
 - e. Attorney It was reported that the Intervener Funds for the Agricola Wind Project will be split between the Alliance to Preserve the Finger Lakes (\$24,750), and the Towns of

Venice and Scipio (\$37,125 each). The Road Use Agreement is in revision while the Host Community Agreement and the Decommissioning Agreement are waiting for the first draft. The Sholinsky Article 7 summary judgement will be filed jointly by the town and county. There are public comment hearings scheduled next week on the RAPID (Renewable Action Through Project Interconnection and Deployment) Act. The Scipio Solar Project is progressing with signatures obtained on the Decommissioning Agreement. The Host Community Agreement needs to be signed, the Town Engineer needs to review the engineering plans, and the town attorney needs to verify all agreements are in order before the permit will be granted.
