We have been enjoying some wonderful early fall weather this past week. With it comes a reminder that our **fall cleanup day is scheduled for October 4 from 9 am to 4 pm.** As always, we will have 5 dumpsters for regular items not accepted at the recycling dumpsters or the compactor. Unfortunately, we will not be accepting mattresses or box springs, as the cost has escalated to \$150 each. Additionally, we will have a dumpster for metal.

While you are bringing items that day, why not plan to take home some delicious chicken from the Scipio fire department? They will begin dispensing the dinners **around 11 am**, and *reservations are suggested* by calling Wayne Pettit at 315-730-8887.

I trust you are enjoying their nice new sign, which was purchased through a grant. Tammy Pettit David is doing a great job of keeping it current and informative.

Two weeks later on **October 18**, there will be an *electronics recycling day* where items can be taken to the county highway building on Long Hill Road just east of Venice Center. **Drop-offs can be made between the hours of 10 and 1.**

Additionally, there will be a *hazardous household waste event* on **October 25 from 9-12:30** at 7413 County House Road in Auburn. *Registration is required and opens on September 19.*

While we are accustomed to a lot of truck and agricultural traffic most of the year, it will increase as the harvesting of corn silage begins. Please be cautious, slow down, and pass only when it is safe.

We are working on the town budget, which will be presented to the town board prior to the **October 8** meeting for their review. If you would like to see a copy of that proposal prior to the meeting, let me know and I can email a copy to you.

The public meeting and final vote will be held at the November 12 meeting.
